**Important Note to All Researchers**

Given the number of requests, and the need to respect accepted ethical guidelines, data collection for research collected on behalf of DND/CF (i.e., contracted or internal research) or using DND/CF resources (either materiel or personnel) are regulated by CANFORGEN 198/08.

Types of data collection that are typically covered by this regulation include surveys or focus groups of CF personnel or their families.

Approval for such data collection efforts may be required and can be obtained from the Social Science Research Review Board (SSRRB), an ethical and technical review board established by the Department of National Defence.

Researchers are responsible for contacting the SSRRB coordinator, either by phone (613-995-8492) or by email ([tracey.aker@forces.gc.ca](mailto:tracey.aker@forces.gc.ca)) to determine whether approval is required, or to request additional information regarding the provisions of CANFORGEN 198/08.

Decisions on requests for approval are usually offered within two or three weeks.

The conference will investigate the prospects for interoperability by addressing three questions:

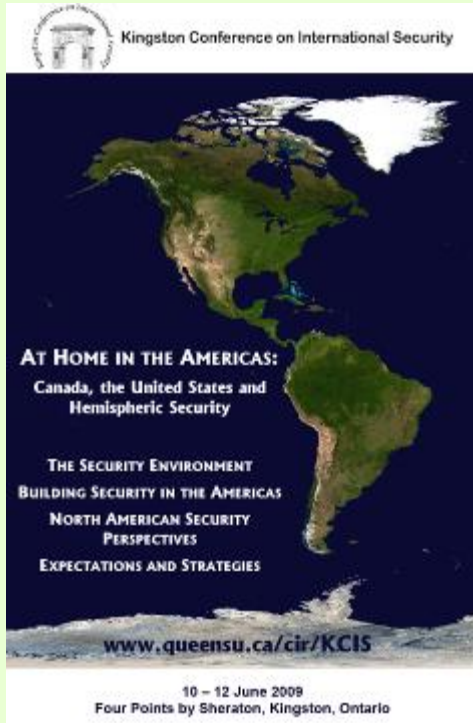

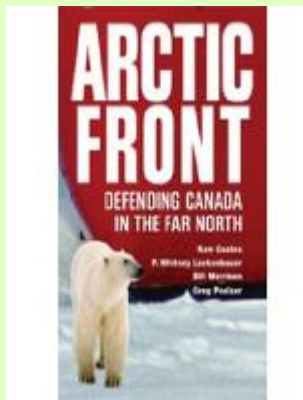
